MINUTES – On motion of Commissioner Schambach, seconded by Commissioner Miller, the Commission approved the minutes of the Special Session held July 23rd, 2013. Commissioner Mason abstained as he was not present for that meeting. Motion carried.

<u>DEL. DAVE EVANS</u> Del Evans appeared before the Commission to inform them that he has spoken with the Transportation Committee about the increased truck traffic on Jefferson & Seventh Sts, Moundsville. While he realized that the County Commission has no control over the traffic, he urges everyone in attendance to attend the

Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission meeting on roads beginning at 4 p.m. at Oglebay Park. The Commissioners were in agreement about the increase in traffic.

<u>COMMISSIONER COMMENTS</u> –

COMMISSIONER MILLER, COMMISSIONER MASON attended the Ribbon cutting ceremony at the Marshall County Fair. The ceremony was held indoors due to inclement weather.

COMMISSIONER MILLER, COMMISSIONER MASON also attended the Bel o Mar meeting last Thursday at the Belmont County Courthouse. After 35 years of service, this was the last meeting for Bill Phipps to preside over before his retirement. Scott Hicks will take over as director.

COMMISSIONER MILLER, COMMISSIONER SHAMBACH commented on the recent Fox News story regarding the closing of the Kammer-Mitchell Plant in Marshall County. COMMISSIONER SHAMBACH further commented that the EPA is forcing many companies out of business. COMMISSIONER SHAMBACH, fellow Commissioners and Betsy Frohnapfel, County Administration recently met with Silling Associates to negotiate the fees for architectural/engineering services for the public safety building.

A moment of silence was held for the passing of George P Mitchell, considered to be the father/ inventor of the fracking process.

There will be an open house held on Thursday from 6-8 for the Marshall County Day Care.

GRAND VUE PARK – Craig White, General Manager of Grand Vue Park, appeared before the commission and updated them on the new skating facilities at the Park. He noted that there were 15 skaters in attendance on Sunday. A local hockey team plans on using this facility for drills, and 24 Bethany College Students will be attending a 14 day program for a team building course. Wheeling Jesuit University and West Liberty University Volley Ball Teams will also be using the Park for team building exercises. Upcoming events at the Park are as follows:

PUBLIC HEARING 2ND READING OF PROPOSED HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX

A question was proposed from Craig White regarding when the tax should begin, as he has several bookings already paid in full. The process will be clarified by the Prosecuting Attorney's office.

<u>911</u> – Director Larry Newell appeared before the Commission to present a contract for AIS Network equipment, from Motorola. This equipment is a digital recording system to be used in the 911 center. The total cost for the equipment and service would be \$86,993. This would be paid for out of 911 fees. After some discussion, on motion of Commissioner Schambach, seconded by Commissioner Miller, the Commission voted to approve the purchase. Motion carried.

<u>APPALACHIAN OUT REACH PROGRAM</u> – Rose Hart, Director, came before the Commissioners to request funding in the amount of \$10,000 for the purchase of a new truck for the organization. After some discussion, on motion of Commissioner Schambach, seconded by Commissioner Miller, the commission voted to table the request. Motion carried.

<u>WVCORP – On motion of Commissioner Schambach, seconded by Commissioner Miller, the Commission approved the contract for the West Virginia Counties Group Self Insurance Risk Pool. Motion carried.</u>
